

2023 SHMP Revisions Log

The 2023 SHMP Revisions Log discusses changes that were made during the 2023 update of the plan. The log shows each FEMA requirement and where the information can be found on the website, along with a brief discussion of changes that were made. FEMA updated the [State Mitigation Planning Policy Guide](#) in 2022 and the changes were made effective April 19, 2023. The 2023 SHMP and the revisions log both reflect the new guidance. In line with the new guidance, the Repetitive Loss elements were removed and two new sections were added: High Hazard Potential Dams and Fire Management Assistance Grants. See below to reference how these new elements were addressed. Along with the policy guide changes, the 2023 update also included transitioning the SHMP to a fully online web-based platform. As such, the location of each element is notated as a web link in the log below.

The Historic Occurrences section for all hazard profiles was updated to reflect events that occurred since the previous update. Information is current as of December 31, 2022. The State of Florida Profile includes new maps of various features in Florida (natural environment, people/social vulnerability, infrastructure/economy, government), as well as a timeline of declared disasters.
