Implementing the SHMP

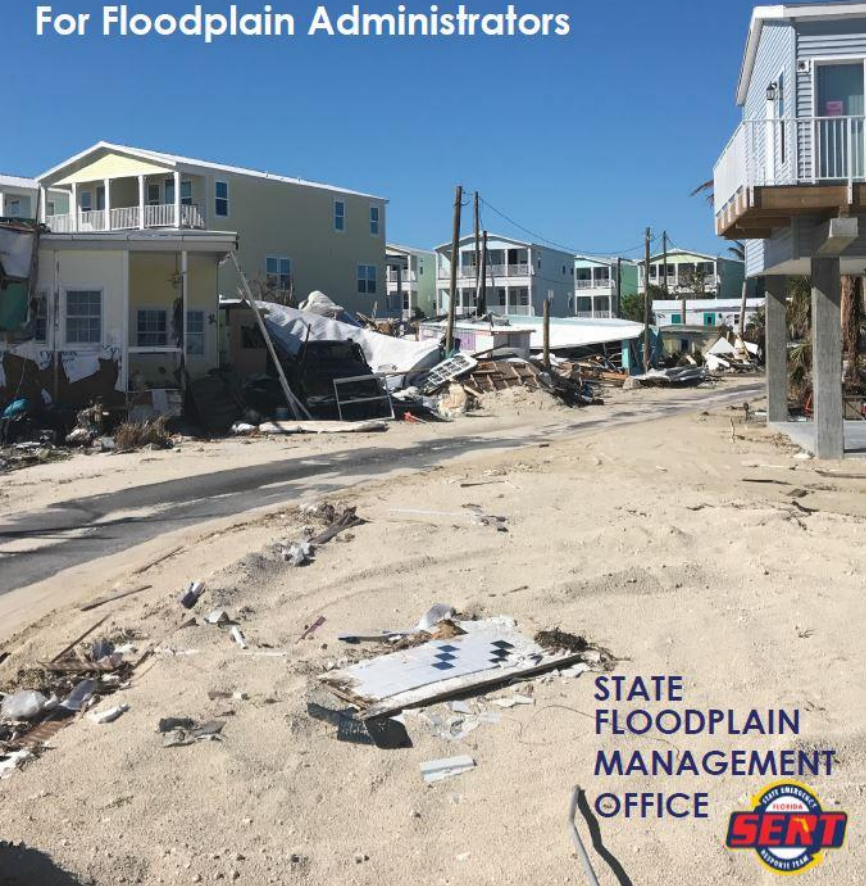
- Goal 1, Objective 1.3: Integrate mitigation practices throughout all state plans, programs, and policies.
- Goal 2, Objective 2.2: Assist in integrating hazard mitigation concept into other local and regional planning efforts such as comprehensive plans, local mitigation strategies, and comprehensive emergency management plans.
- Goal 4, Objective 4.1: Support land acquisition programs that reduce or eliminate potential future losses due to natural hazards and that are compatible with the protection of natural or cultural resources.
- Goal 4, Objective 4.2: Support restoration and conservation of natural resources wherever possible.
- Goal 4, Objective 4.6: Coordinate effective partnerships between state agencies for floodplain management.

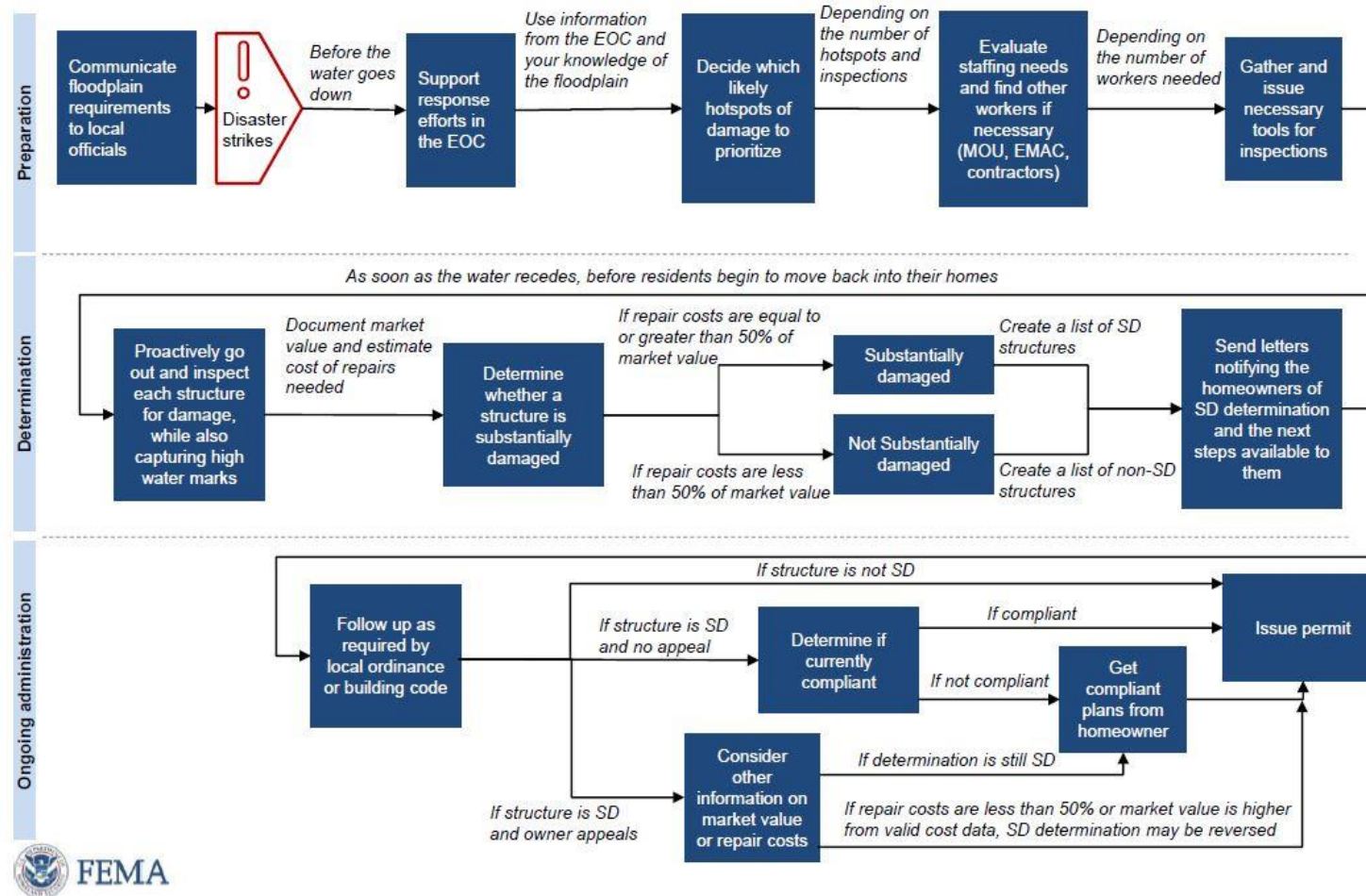

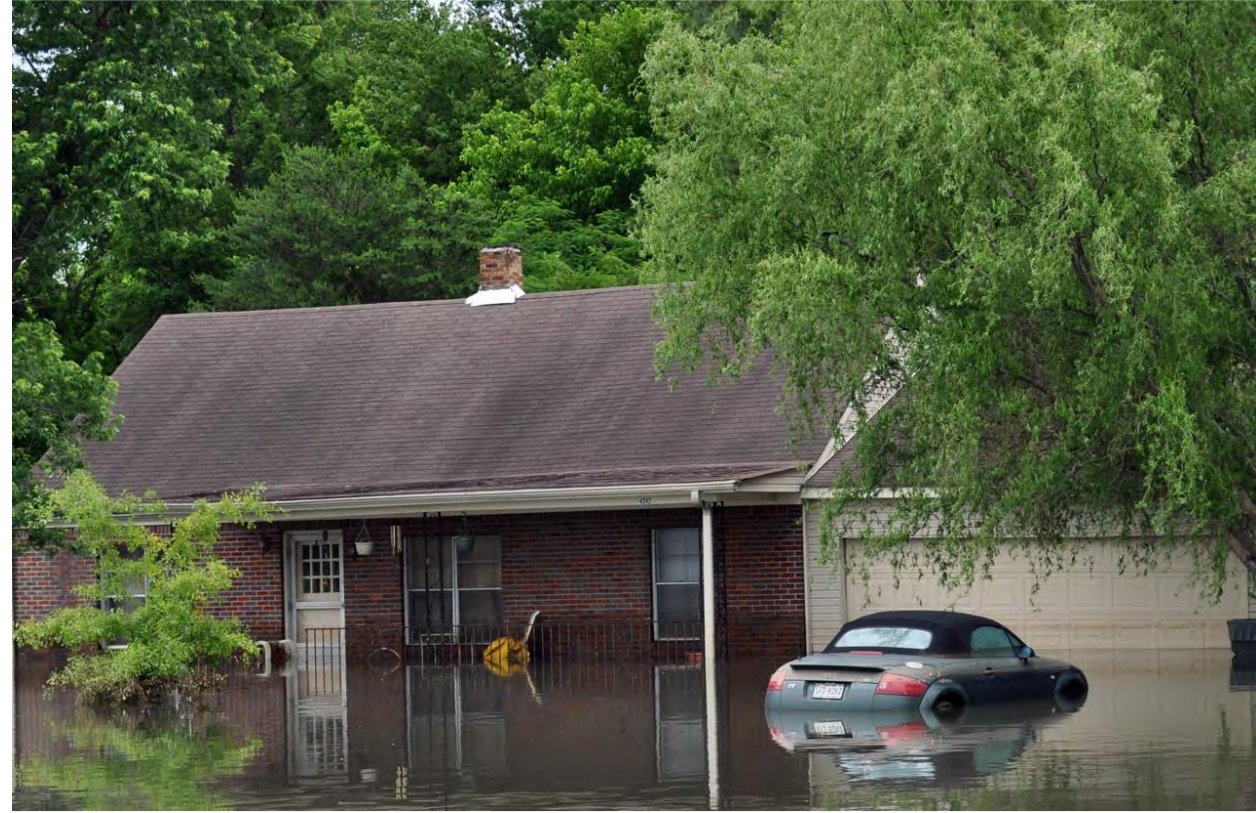
Best Practice Substantial Damage Process

Action 6: Identify Mitigation Funding

- When community officials know about available funding sources and a timeline of availability they can help families and property owners make decisions about approaches to mitigating during the long-term recovery process, which also may bear on alternatives for construction and local permitting.

- Action 6: Identify Post-Disaster Mitigation Funding Assistance

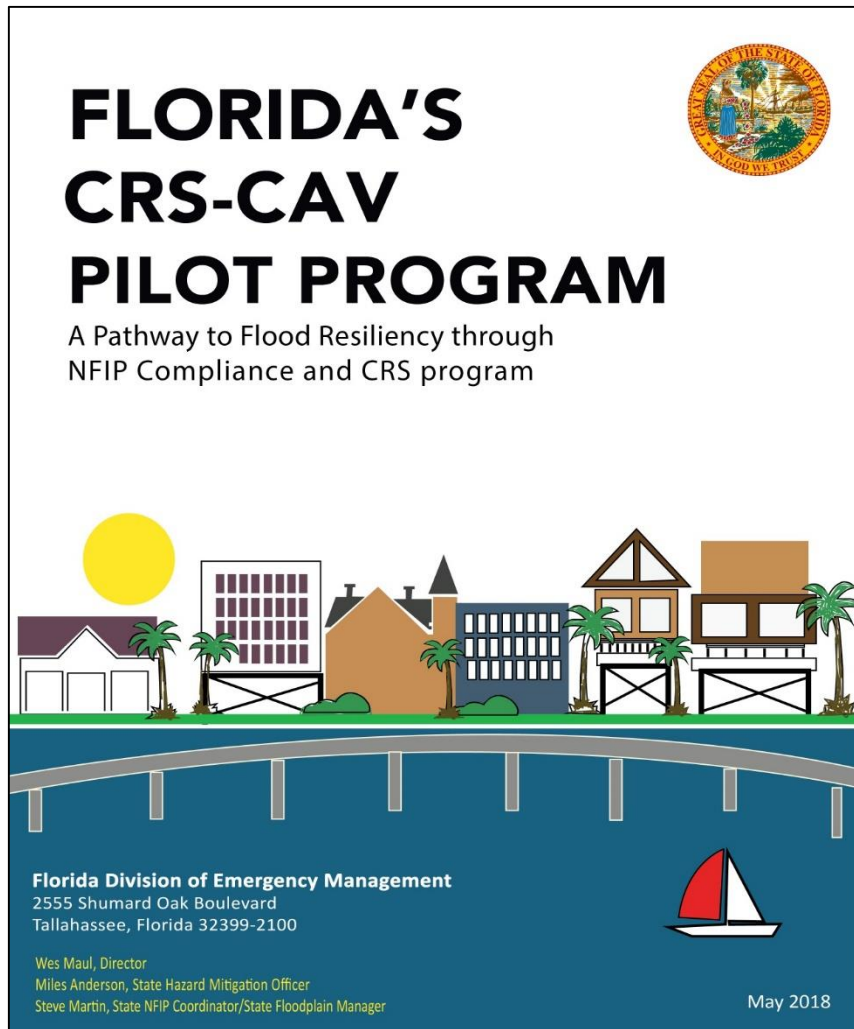

THIRA Integration

THIRA

- Federal requirement
- Strategic foundation for implementing the National Preparedness System
- Threats and Hazards: Natural, Technological, Human-Caused
- Steps:
 1. Identify Threats and Hazards
 2. Give Threats and Hazards Context
 3. Establish Capability Targets (relate to Core Capabilities)

HIRA

- SHMP requirement
- Hazards: Natural
- Factual basis for the actions proposed in the Mitigation Plan
- Steps:
 1. Identify Hazards
 2. Profile Hazard Events
 3. Inventory Assets
 4. Estimate Potential Human and Economic Losses based on Exposure and Vulnerability of People, Buildings, and Infrastructure



THIRA Integration

- Similar process and goal
- Align HIRA and THIRA to identify and profile the same hazards
- Ensure that data is consistent
- Should come up with the same results
 - Same hazards to which Florida is most vulnerable

HMGP Update

Application Deadline:

Postmarked on or before August 6th, 2018

If hand delivering, no later than 5:00 PM EDT on August 6th, 2018

- Continue to ask questions early and often, if needed.
- See Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for mailing address as well as project eligibility information.



HMGP Update

- Private Non-Profit Houses of Worship (PNPHW)
 - Recent changes to eligibility of Private Non-Profit Houses of Worship (PNPHW) now allow them to be their own sub-applicant under the HMGP just like any other Private Non-Profit.
 - Eligible mitigation projects for PNPHW are no longer limited to activities that only benefit the whole community and may be for the primary benefit of the PNPHW.

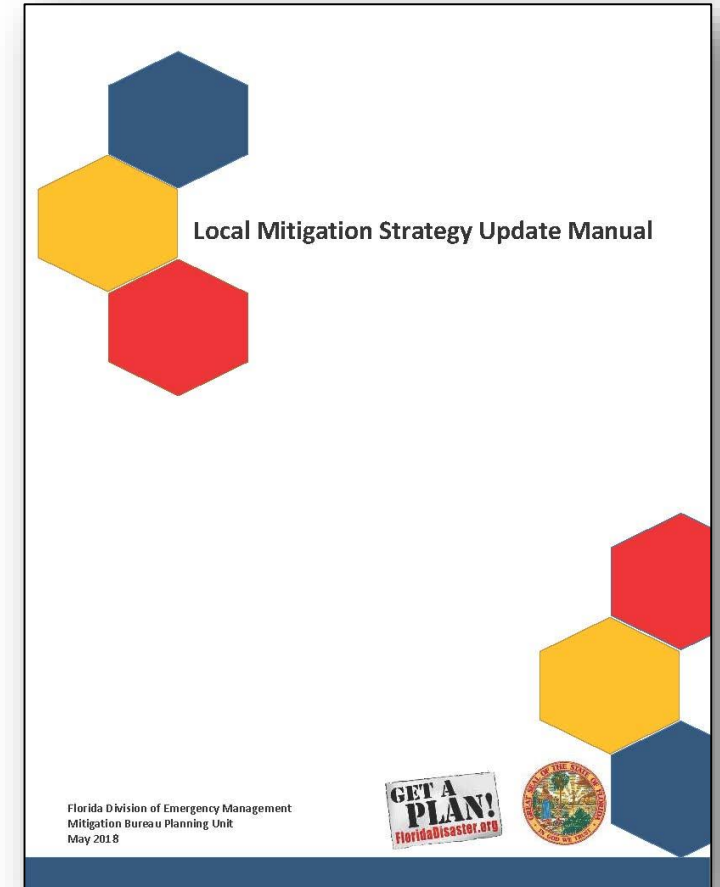
